
### Scouts BSA Troop 1659 News Flags Across the Community

#### Balance Sheet

The August 31, 2023 balance sheet shows \$572,992 in the bank.

#### Statement of Revenue & Expense

For August 2023, revenue was above budget by \$4,022 primarily due to higher than budgeted interest income. Expenses were below budget by \$4,775 was mainly due to lower than budgeted legal expense.

#### Transaction report

We had our normal operating expenses in the month of August.

#### Additional Notes:

Our 2023 Maintenance Fee of \$343 was approved at the November 2022 meeting and was mailed out the first week of December and was due at the beginning of January 2023. If it has not been paid it is past due therefore fees and interest will be added to it until paid. You can call the accountant to find out how much you owe on your account at 832-910-7525.

Our 2023 Security Fee being collected on the water bill in the amount of \$31.75 was approved at the November 2022 meeting and has been presented to Bammel UD and was increased on the March water bill.


the Island's Sandhill Cranes at **Holiday** with the Cranes, Dec. 9 – 10, 2023.
