Please understand we do not know the circumstances or situation a property owner or tenant is dealing with we only know there is a violation. If you receive a letter and there are extenuating circumstances then please contact us and let us know. Do not stew on it, complain, or get stressed out as there are always ways to fix a violation **but if you do not contact us** then we do not know. In some cases, we may be able to help out and get the violation resolved, but the idea of a neighborhood is a neighbor helping a neighbor.

Deed restrictions committee continues its efforts to Identify Violations every month. We have located several violations due to lawn negligence. Balance Sheet

The March 31, 2025, balance sheet shows \$539,241 in the bank.

Statement of Revenue & Expense

For March 2025, revenue was above budget by \$1,589 primarily due to higher-than-expected security receipts income. Expenses were above budget by (\$1,692), which was mainly due to being over budget on Security Camera Maint. Expense partially offset by being under on Security patrol Expense.

Transaction report

We had our normal operating expenses in the month of March.

Additional Notes:

Our 2025 Maintenance Fee of \$362 was approved at the November 2024 meeting and was mailed out the first week of December and is due at the beginning of January 2025. If it was not paid by January 31st, 2025, there will be fees and interest added to it until paid.

Our 2025 Security Fee to be collected on the monthly water bill in the amount of \$33.25 was approved at the November 2024 meeting and will be sent to Bammel UD for the March 2025 bill to help with the increases we received in the new contract in October 2024 for the new year.

venience of trash collection, no one wants to see bins taking center stage. Please remember to store them out of view and after pickup to keep things looking neat.

Let's keep our neighborhood looking its best—one freshly edged lawn at a time!

'Remember to: Bundle small branches less than 4-feet in length and smaller than 18-inches in diameter and place next to the trash bags for collection. Otherwise, the trash company will not collect your debris. Which at that point you will be served a violation notice if debris remains uncollected for more than a week. Please be kind to others and to your community, do not blow your debris on your neighbor's side or leave it in the street. Doing this will not only cause conflict between neighbors but the bigger issue that this action creates will be to our storm system. Preventing this simple act will help the communities storm system from flooding and backing upduring rainy weather.

Please continue to monitor your property for any diseased or pre-decayed trees needing to be cut down. We want to prevent present and future damage to the neighborhood and avoid hazardous situations in advance. If you require a professional opinion for dead tree removal, contact the Deed Restrictions Committee at ocvdeedrestrictionscommittee@g mail.com for further information.

Let's Keep It Neighborly – While we appreciate the hard work of business owners and weekend warriors, parking trailers and commercial vehicles in driveways or on the street can lead to unwanted **violations and costly fines**. Our goal is to prevent these issues before they happen, saving everyone time and money.

Parking Reminder - As a reminder, parking on lawns is not permitted at any time. This policy helps maintain the appearance and integrity of our neighborhood, protects landscaping, and ensures compliance with local ordinances. We kindly ask that all vehicles be parked in designated driveways or approved areas only. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated in keeping our community clean and well-kept.

Avoid the Fees, Skip the Hassle – Some violations come with hefty fines and we'd rather you keep that money in your pocket! an outdoor flag and pole, installing a flat device in your yard that will not interfere with lawn maintenance.


We are pleased to also offer military branch flags. Choose from Army, Navy, Air Force, Marines, Coast Guard, or Space

Hot Car Deaths: A Preventable Tragedy

In 2024, 40 children died after being left or trapped in hot cars. As of early 2025, there has already been three deaths reported. These statistics are more than numbers - they are urgent reminders of the responsibility we all share.

How hot does a car get?

Let's follow along with the Pediatric Injury Prevention Program to see how hot the inside of a car can get during the day.

10:30 am – Outdoor Temperature 89.3 Vehicle Temperature 92.3

11:15 am – Outdoor Temperature 88.4

Vehicle Temperature 129 12:15 pm – Outdoor Temperature 88.7

Vehicle Temperature 161

1:15 pm – Outdoor Temperature 91.3

Vehicle Temperature 171

2:15 pm – Outdoor Temperature 88.6

Vehicle Temperature 160

3:15 pm –Outdoor Temperature 87.3 Vehicle Temperature 138

Even with outdoor temperatures in the high 80s, the inside of the vehicle soared to **over 170°F**. These extreme temperatures can be fatal for children in just minutes.

There were 40 hot car deaths in 2024. The danger from high temperatures is particularly acute for young children because their bodies heat up three to five times faster than adult bodies, according to the American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP). That's because young children, especially babies, lack the ability to efficiently regulate their body temperature. Children dehydrate more quickly than adults.

Tips to Prevent Heatstroke

You can take simple but effective steps to protect children from heatstroke:

- Lock your vehicle when not in use to prevent children from climbing in unnoticed.
- Keep car keys/remote starters out of children's reach.
- Never leave a child alone in a vehicle—not even for a moment.
- Use reminders: Place a personal item like your phone, purse, or shoe in the back seat to prompt you to check.
- Make a habit of "Park. Look. Lock." Always confirm your child is with a caregiver or safely out of the car.

If you see a child alone in a car, call 911 immediately. Emergency responders are trained to act fast in these situations.


